### **GOLD DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD 2019/2020**

I write to alert you to the opportunity for your son/daughter to take part in the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award that will run in 2019/2020. We offer two options for the expedition element of the Award (canoeing or walking) but expect all who show interest to be happy to join either group. Numbers ultimately dictate group sizes, (both of which have limits based on pupil to instructor ratios), so we finalise in early September and endeavour to accommodate preferences then. There will be options for those who wish to remain in the CCF and complete the Gold Award, either by joining the groups set out in this letter or creating a separate group.

#### Canoeing options

Based on last year's costs, (and dependent on the group reaching its capacity of 28), the UK based canoe option is estimated to cost £430. Payment for this option is taken by a £100 deposit and then subsequent payments of £165 on the Lent and Summer bills plus the usual termly activities billing. If the group size changes then costs may increase slightly but will include canoe hire, instruction, travel and campsite fees. Essentially, the option breaks down into the following sections:

- Three days intensive training on the River Severn in Shrewsbury during October 'Expos' with 'Drummond Outdoor' who are AALA qualified instructors.
- A three day/two night Practice Expedition (**provisionally** Friday 24<sup>th</sup> April to Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2020) along the River Severn from Welshpool to Atcham, near Shrewsbury. This includes a further day's qualified instruction and expedition de-brief by 'Drummond Outdoor'.
- A further day's training at Jackfield Rapids, Ironbridge in early June 2020 for competence on Grade 2 level water.
- The final five day/four night Qualifying Expedition on the River Wye. This takes place in the final week of Summer Term during our College's Expeditions Week.

#### Walking options

Furthermore, there is also the chance for pupils to opt for a walking expedition and the College is looking to outside providers for this with costs, (dependent upon the group reaching its capacity of 14), currently estimated at about £340 plus the usual termly activities billing. The costs above include accommodation and campsite fees but not food or kit for the following:

- Three days in October Expeditions for basic training including extensive map work and expedition skills.
- Ten days training and skill sessions across our Thursday afternoon activity programme.
- Three day Easter practice expedition across the Berwyn or Snowdonia mountain ranges in Wales, (**provisionally** Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May to Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2020).
- Five day qualifying expedition across a mountainous area in Wales. This takes place in the final week of Summer Term during our College's Expeditions Week.

Please return the attached permission slip to register interest stating a preferred option and a cheque deposit of £100 made payable to Ellesmere College. This should be addressed to Mr Jim Underhill, Ellesmere College, Ellesmere, Shropshire SY12 9AB ([jim.underhill@ellesmere.com](mailto:jim.underhill@ellesmere.com)). Alternatively you can make a card payment via [www.ellesmere.com/payment](http://www.ellesmere.com/payment), (noting this as "Gold DofE deposit"), then email me to confirm and state your child's group preference.

We confirm numbers, final costs and places by the end of September and expect all candidates to want to complete the award and not be concerned about whether they canoe or walk so that we can more easily make up the groups.

For the Gold Award, candidates must also complete a five-day Residential course alongside the Skills, Volunteering, Expedition and Physical sections. This can incur an extra cost and is something that each candidate must attend on their own (i.e. not with College friends) and therefore we encourage students to organise this section as early as possible. Completion is best suited during Year 12 so that it does not impact Year 13 revision and must be completed outside of College term time. However, if your child is currently 16 or over they can complete a Residential from mid-July in advance of signing up for the Award. Finally – and most importantly - the Gold challenge requires a good deal of independence, maturity and for us to be able to trust those involved in potentially hazardous situations. Therefore, previous behaviour and success on the Award (or, indeed, in other environments) will be taken into account as we make up the groups this academic year.
